

Mason County Schools Re-entry Plan

Beginning January 18, 2021

For the week of January 18, 2021:

- Monday, January 18, 2021 is Martin Luther King, Jr Holiday, No school for staff or students.
- By orders from Governor Justice, all in-person instruction will begin in schools on January 19, 2021.
- Mason County Schools will continue the 2-3 blended model the week of January 18 thru 22, 2021. There will be no change to students in virtual school. Mason County Schools **will not** use the DHHR color map for the week of January 18 thru 22.
- All school times and bus routes will remain the same.
- Tuesday, January 19, 2021 Monday/Tuesday students will report to school.
- Wednesday, January 20, 2021, will be a remote day for all students. All staff will report to work. Meals for virtual students will be available from 11:00 am to 12:00 pm at each school.
- Thursday January 21 and Friday January 22, 2021, all Thursday/Friday students will report to school.
- Friday, January 22, 2021 is the end of the first semester.

Beginning the week of January 25, 2021 and continuing until further notice:

Students in grades preK-8

- All students grades preK-8 that attend in-person will report to school on Monday through Thursday of every week. Fridays will be a remote learning day. All staff will report to work.
- Per Governor Justice, the DHHR color map **will not** be used to determine if students attend school.
- Mason County teacher led virtual school will continue. Meals will be available for virtual students 11:00 am to 12:00 pm on every Friday.

Students in grades 9-12

- All students grades 9-12 attending in-person school, will report to school on Monday through Thursday of every week unless Mason County is Red on the DHHR map. Fridays will be a remote learning day.
- Mason County teacher led virtual school will continue. Meals will be available for virtual students 11:00 am to 12:00 pm on every Friday.

The following information comes from Governor Justice's order concerning resuming in-person instruction for students in grades 9-12.

- Students will attend school in-person unless their county is red on the DHHR County Alert System map. <https://dhhr.wv.gov/COVID-19/Pages/default.aspx>
- Students Grades 9 thru 12 will move to remote learning the day after Mason County turns red on the DHHR County Alert System Map.
- The Superintendent, working with the local Health Department, will determine and direct when 9 thru 12 grade students will resume in-person learning. You will be notified by the call-out system.

Even when Mason County is red on the DHHR County Alert System map, teachers and staff will continue essential student support services including meals, student engagement, all special education services and support to at-risk students.

INFORMATION FOR ALL MASON COUNTY STUDENTS:

- All school times will continue as they have been from the beginning of school
- The times for bus pick-ups and drop-offs may change due to more students being picked up on every run. Bus drivers will notify parents if the times change.
